
COVID-19 Vaccine Update 09/27/2021- Booster doses

In accordance with the most recent FDA and CDC recommendations, Bremo Pharmacy is able to offer the **Johnson & Johnson (Janssen)**, **Moderna, or Pfizer** COVID-19 vaccines to all eligible patients according to recommendations summarized below. Additionally, we have included a chart below to more easily navigate these recommendations.

Do I need a COVID-19 booster vaccine today?



On September 24th 2021, the CDC & FDA approved a booster dose of the Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 vaccine for specific groups. These recommendations <u>only</u> apply to people who previously received a Pfizer-BioNTech primary series (i.e., the first 2 doses of a COVID-19 vaccine).

To summarize their recommendations:

- CDC recommends that the following groups **should** receive a booster dose of Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 Vaccine at least 6 months after completing their Pfizer-BioNTech primary series (i.e., the first 2 doses of a COVID-19 vaccine):
 - o people aged 65 years and older
 - o residents aged 18 years and older in long-term care settings
 - people aged 50–64 years with <u>underlying medical conditions</u>
- CDC also recommends that the following groups **may** receive a booster dose of Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 Vaccine at least 6 months after completing their Pfizer-BioNTech primary series, based on their individual benefits and risks:
 - people aged 18–49 years with <u>underlying medical conditions</u>
 - people aged 18–64 years at increased risk for COVID-19 exposure and transmission because of occupational or institutional setting

On August 13th 2021, the CDC & FDA approved a third dose of the Pfizer-BioNTech or Moderna COVID-19 vaccines for <u>immunocompromised patients</u>.

To summarize their recommendations:

• Those eligible for third doses of Moderna or Pfizer BioNTech COVID-19 vaccines include individuals that are undergoing active cancer treatment, organ transplant recipients, stem cell recipients in the last 2 years, taking medications that suppresses the immune system, have advanced or untreated HIV, or undergoing active treatment with high dose corticosteroids.
